



How to Submit Geolocation with Photos

How to turn on the geotagging feature, take a photo with geolocation, and show and submit the metadata needed.

#1 – Turning on the Geotagging Feature

Look below for the specific instructions based on your phone's operating system.

Apple (iOS)

- Open iOS settings app
- Navigate to Privacy section
- Go to Location services
- Go to Camera App
- Change Allow location access to “while using the app.”

Android

- Click on Settings on your device's home screen (or in the All Apps menu)
- Scroll until you find “Location” or “Location and Security” (for some versions), then tap the “Location” option.
- Set the toggle at the top to On.

#2 – Taking a Photo with Geolocation On

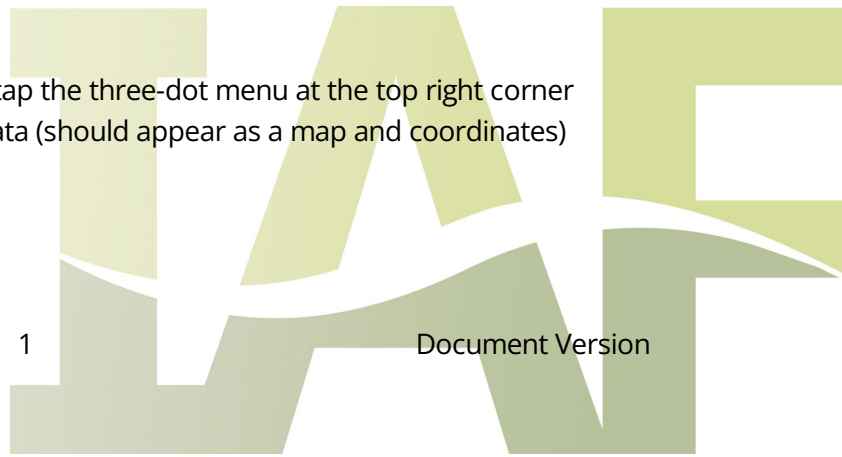
Now that you have enabled Geotagging on your device, simply take a photo of the area that needs to be submitted.

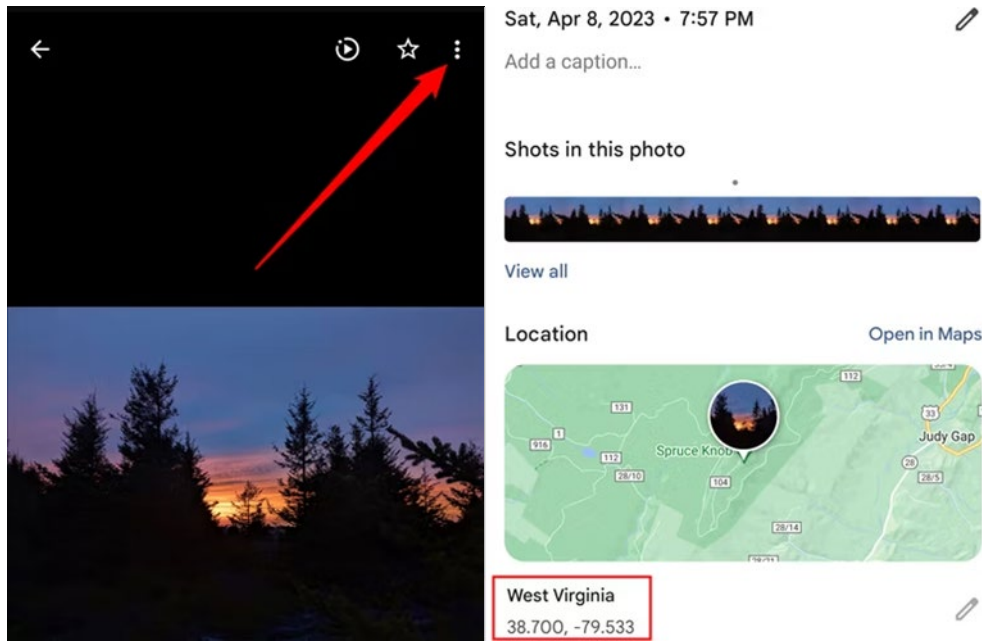
#3 – How to View and Capture Metadata

Finding location data (metadata) of the photos taken on Android phones, iPhones, Windows PCs, and Macs

Android

- Open the image in the Photos app and tap the three-dot menu at the top right corner
- Scroll down until you see the location data (should appear as a map and coordinates)

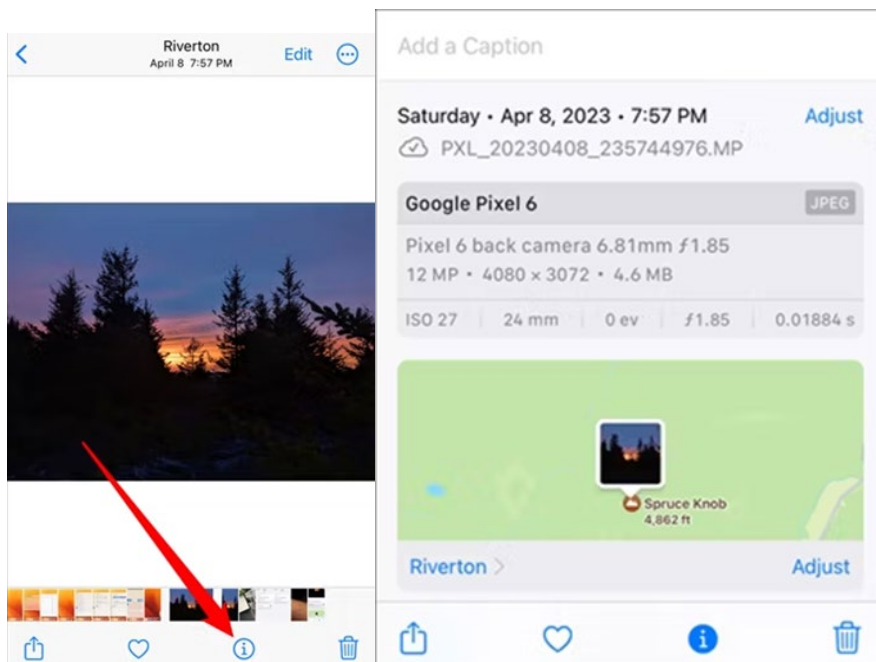




- Now that you have found the metadata, take a screenshot of it and submit both the original image and the screenshot of the geolocation

iPhones

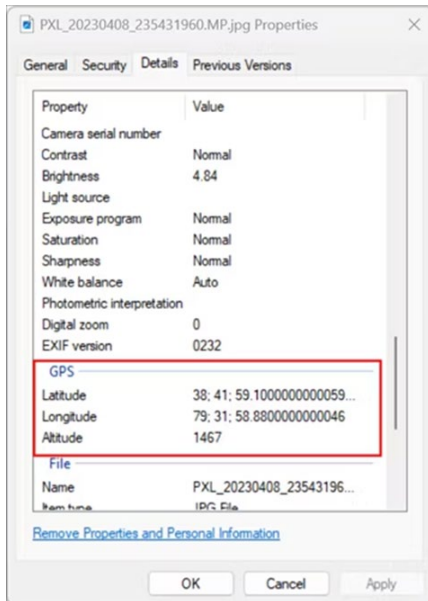
- Open the image in the Photos app and tap the "i" menu icon at the bottom of the screen
- You won't see the actual GPS coordinates, but you can see where the photo was taken on a map



- Now that you have found the metadata, take a screenshot of it and submit both the original image and the screenshot of the geolocation

Windows PC

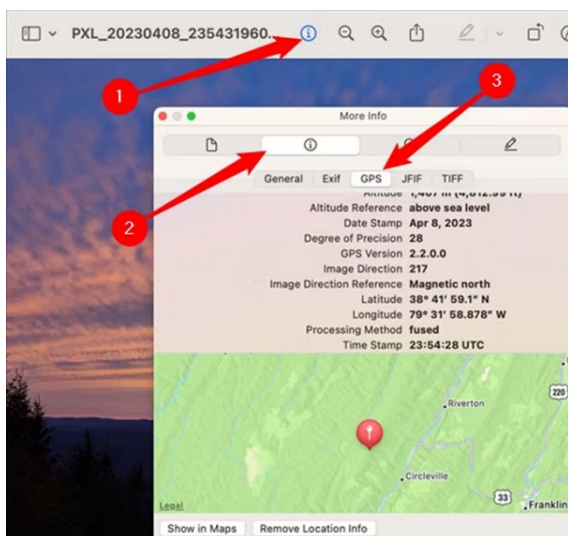
- Open the Image Folder, right-click a picture file, select "Properties," and then click "Details" in the properties window. Look for Latitude and Longitude coordinates under GPS



- Now that you have found the metadata, take a screengrab of it with the Snipping Tool found on the computer or Windows key+PrtScn and submit both the original image and the screenshot of the geolocation

Mac

- Open the Image Folder, right-click the image file (or Control+click it), and select "Get Info." You'll find the Latitude and Longitude coordinates under the "More Info" section.
- You can also open the image, click the "i" button at the top, click the "i" button that appears in the new popup, and then select the "GPS" tab.



- Now that you have found the metadata, take a screengrab of it with Command+Shift+'3' and submit both the original image and the screenshot of the geolocation
